

# Paramedic, Baby Reportedly Ejected From Vehicle

## Officials: Witnesses See Truck Driver Run Red Light

**HOUSTON** -- A private ambulance and a garbage truck collided in north Houston, ejecting a paramedic from the vehicle, Monday morning.

The Harris County Sheriff's Office said the accident occurred when the ambulance, proceeding east on the Beltway 8 feeder road, and the garbage truck, proceeding north on the Hardy Toll Road feeder road, collided around 9:30 a.m.

Expert EMS, the ambulance's owner, said four people were inside the vehicle when the accident happened -- an 8-month-old girl, a passenger, a paramedic and the driver.

An 8-month-old girl, who was in the back of the emergency vehicle, was being taken to a doctor's appointment at Texas Children's Hospital when the crash occurred.

The 8-month-old girl and paramedic Cameron Munk, 24, of Spring, were ejected from the vehicle, according to accident investigators.

Officials said Munk and the 8-month-old baby were taken to Memorial Hermann Hospital in serious condition.

The garbage truck driver was not injured.

Harris County Precinct 1 Constable Deputy's Office and the Houston Police Department's Truck

Enforcement Unit are investigating the accident.

"We have two eye witnesses that have indicated that the dump truck operator ran the red light. The dump truck operator is indicating his light was green," Houston Police Department Truck Enforcement Unit Sgt. C.J. Klausner said.

An HPD official said the driver of the garbage truck might be cited for allegedly running through a red light.

The incident remains under investigation.
